TECHNICAL WORK: 20 marks

Scales and Arpeggios for Guitar Book

To be played from memory

Scales: mm J 96

Major Scales of Db and Gb Harmonic Minor Scale of G# Melodic Minor Scale of Bb

**Whole Tone Scale on C,** position I, string 5 Two octaves, ascending and descending.

Arpeggios: mm , 84

Db and Gb Major G# and Bb Minor C Diminished seventh

Two octaves, ascending and descending.

#### AURAL: 15 marks

- ➤ To recognize whether a chord played in root position is a major seventh, minor seventh or dominant seventh.
- To recognize whether a phrase is in a major or minor key.
- To identify the chord progression I, IV, V7 within a twelve bar phrase. In either 3/4 or 4/4 time. The phrase will be played, and the candidate will then identify where the progression occurred.

## VIVA VOCE: 10 marks

- General questions will be asked about all pieces performed and the technical work for this grade.
- To explain the construction of the major seventh, minor seventh and dominant seventh chords.
- To explain the construction of the whole tone scale.
- To demonstrate the Hammer On and Pull off technique.

### **SIGHT READING:** 15 marks

- To pick a sixteen bar melody.
- In any key up to and including three sharps or three flats.

## **MELODY OUTLINE**: 15 marks

- The four bar introduction must include a melody line and chords.
- Time values of a semibreve, to a quaver and quaver triplet (inclusive) **must** be used.
- Must use harmony under the melody notes for a minimum of eight bars.
- > Must include passing notes.
- > Must be picked.
- Expression and dynamics must be included and marked on the music.
- > The work **must** be given a title.
- The final work must be either computer written or hand written by the candidate.
- A copy of the melody outline must be sent to the Area Manager 21 days prior to the commencement date of the examinations as specified on the NZMSM calendar.

<u>PIECES</u>: 25 marks for each piece. Graded Tunes, Book 4

Supplementary Tunes, Book 2

Three pieces must be performed, **one** piece from each section.

All pieces must have an introduction and ending where none is given.

Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music.

The candidate should be encouraged to develop their own style and arrangement ability within the given criteria.

> Choose **one** piece from the list above.

## **Criteria for this section:**

- > **Must** include harmony.
- > Must use folk pick.
- > Must include dual play.

No repeats except D.C. or D.S. or as indicated for a specific piece.

#### Section II: Supplementary 2

Get Back page 9 That'll be the Day page 11

Homeward Bound page 21 change to 2/4

> Choose **one** piece from the list above.

#### **Criteria for this section:**

- ➤ **Must** be either sung by the candidate or accompanied by another instrumentalist.
- > The candidate **must** count in for the accompanist unless the candidate sings.
- > **Must** include some of the following:

Hammer On Pull Off Slides

- > **Must** choose own strum.
- ➤ **Must** have some degree of the candidate's own arrangement.
- ➤ Any alterations **must** be marked on the music **by the candidate**.

No repeats except D.C. or D.S. or as indicated for a specific piece.

## **Section III:**

## Graded Tunes, Book 4 or Supplementary Tunes, Book 2

> Choose **one** piece not previously performed from the publications listed above.

## Criteria for this section:

- > **Must** add improvisation.
- The piece **must** be played in **two** different positions, one of which **must** be tabulated **by the candidate.**The tablature **must** include pitch, time values and bar lines.
  An indication of which bars of the piece have been tabulated **must** be noted on the copy.
- > Any alterations **must** be marked on the music **by the candidate**.
- > A copy of the arrangement must be sent to the Area Manager 21 days prior to the commencement date of the examinations as specified on the NZMSM calendar.

Repeats are optional.

All markings must be removed from pieces except expression marks, position changes and notation of arrangement.
