N.Z. MODERN SCHOOL OF MUSIC KEYBOARD EXAMINATION SYLLABUS PERFORMANCE CERTIFICATE

NOTE:

A minimum pass of 400 marks in the NZMSM Diploma Theory of Music Examination is an additional requirement for this examination.

A copy of the candidate's result sheet must be sent in with the examination entry form.

- The copies of the composition, notated piece and analysis, together with all other arrangements and originals **must** be forwarded to the panel of examiners 21 days prior to the examination date.
- > All pieces and the composition will be performed before a panel of three examiners and an audience.
- An oral interview prior to the performance will be convened by the examiners. This will include a discussion about the analysis for the notated piece, sections I to IV pieces and a discussion about the composition process.
- > A maximum of 200 marks are awarded for this certificate.

PRESENTATION: 10 marks

The standard of dress for this performance is formal.

Marks will be allocated for the standard and presentation of the written material, the programme provided, the interaction with the audience and the overall performance.

ORAL INTERVIEW: 20 marks

- > The interview will be approximately one hour.
- ➤ A discussion about the historical details of the works, the composers, style/genre and the structure of the pieces performed.
- > The candidate will be asked to demonstrate the structure of compound chords and explain the degrees that make up these chords.
- > An understanding of the functions of the electronic keyboard is essential.
- ➤ All books containing the original works **must** be available at the interview.

COMPOSITION: 30 marks

The candidate must be able to demonstrate an advanced level of creative ability and musicality. The composition **must** be between three and five minutes duration.

Criteria for this section:

- An introduction and ending appropriate for this level **must** be added.
- The candidate **must** choose their own time signature/s.
- Repeat signs, Dal Segno and Da Capo may be included.
- Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music.
- > Lyrics **must** be written for the piece or alternatively, the melody **must** be set to a poem.
- > The work **must** be given a title.
- The final work **must** be either computer written or hand written **by the candidate**.

NOTATED TWENTIETH CENTURY PIECE and ANALYSIS 40 marks

(Composer and work from the 20th century)

- From any publication.
- This piece may be performed on the piano.
- The maximum time allowance is eight minutes.

Criteria for this section:

- The piece must be a minimum of three pages.
- The music used for this piece must not contain chord symbols.
- The candidate **must** in their own words, provide a written analysis for this piece. Style, form, history, cadences and chord structure etc. **must** be included.

PIECES: 100 marks

Four works must be performed, one from each section.

An introduction and ending **must** be added where none is given.

The candidate **must** choose pieces of contrasting style, mood and rhythm.

Medleys must modulate into different keys using an appropriate chord progression.

The candidate is expected to use harmony, improvisation and syncopation where appropriate.

Bass chords may be altered or substituted.

Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music.

Voicing, style and tempo registrations must be included and marked on the music.

Discs **may** be used in conjunction with the piece/s, provided that it is the candidate's own work.

Auto accompaniment and manual bass work is expected for sections II, III and IV.

<u>Performance details:</u> the candidate **must** provide the audience with a verbal summary of the content, context and the significance of their chosen pieces.

The original material together with the candidate's arrangements **must** be sent to the panel of examiners.

Section I: 25 marks To Lead an Audience

Arrange a medley suitable for **one** of these three options: a child's birthday party

a Christmas party a senior citizen's group

- Choose pieces from any NZMSM publications.
- The maximum time allowance is five minutes.

Criteria for this section:

- Must be played from memory.
- The candidate **must** supply lyrics for the audience participation.
- The candidate will be expected to lead the audience for this sing-a-long.

Section II: 25 marks Film and/or Show

- Arrange a selection of film or show tunes from **one** composer.
- From any publication, see examples below.
- The maximum time allowance is eight minutes.

Burt Bacharach John Barry Gershwin Maurice Jarre

Elton John Henry Mancini Cole Porter Rogers and Hammerstein

Sherman Bros Rodgers and Hart Lloyd Webber John Williams

Section III: 25 marks

Jazz and/or Blues

- > A sophisticated Jazz or Blues arrangement of **two** pieces.
- From any publication with lead line and chord symbols only.
- The maximum time allowance is eight minutes.

Criteria for this section:

- A bridge passage of eight bars between the two pieces must be improvised at sight.

 The passage will be chorded by the examiners and given to the candidate immediately before the work is performed.
- Accompaniment with other instrumentalist/s is optional.

Section IV: 25 marks

Latin and/or Boogie Woogie Medley

- Choose pieces with a lead line and chord symbols only or a melody line that has been re-written from a Grand stave.
- From any publication.
- > The maximum time allowance is eight minutes.

Criteria for this section:

- The medley **must** include a variety of bass styles as well as the candidate's own bass work.
- The titles of all pieces **must** be listed on the Checklist sheet.

All markings must be removed from pieces except tidy fingering, expression marks, registration settings and notation of arrangement.
