# N.Z. MODERN SCHOOL OF MUSIC MODERN PIANO EXAMINATION SYLLABUS DIPLOMA

NOTE:

A minimum pass of 170 marks in the NZMSM Grade Seven Theory of Music Examination is an additional requirement for this examination.

A copy of the candidate's result sheet must be sent in with the examination entry form.

TECHNICAL WORK: 20 marks

Comprehensive Book of Scales and Arpeggios Magic for Modern Book

To be played from memory.

Scales: mm 144

Any major scale

Four octaves, similar motion, ascending and descending, hands together.

Legato and staccato. forte and piano.

Pentatonic Major and Minor scales of Bb and E

Two octaves, similar motion, ascending and descending, hands together.

Inversions: mm J 96

Diminished seventh of F, F# and G

Two octaves, ascending only, hands together.

Studies: (No pedal)

1. mm J96 Magic for Modern, No.60. The Ninth Chord Whole Tone Scales, both examples.

2. mm o 120 Movement in Perfect Fifths, see overleaf.

AURAL: 10 marks

> To hum or sing the 1, 3, 5 degrees of an augmented or diminished chord.

The tonic will be played and the tonic note given.

The candidate will then give the letter names of the other two notes.

> To recognise whether a phrase is in a major or minor key.

The candidate will then identify whether the ending cadence is plagal (IV-I), imperfect (I-V), perfect (V-I) or interrupted (V-VI).

To observe a four bar phrase and then play it from memory.

In 3/4, 4/4 or 6/8 time.

The bass style may be standard waltz or arpeggio or stride. Candidate's choice.

VIVA VOCE: 10 marks

- General questions will be asked on **all** pieces performed and the technical work for this grade. This will include the background details of the pieces, composers, period and styles.
- To explain and demonstrate the construction of all scales and chords up to and including thirteenths and altered chords.

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#### **MELODY OUTLINE**: 25 marks

The candidate **must** be able to demonstrate an advanced level of creative ability and musicality.

The melody outline should be developed within the criteria given to make a complete piece.

#### Criteria for this section:

- The four bar introduction **must** include a melody line and chords.
- The candidate **must** choose their own time signature/s.
- > May include bass variations.
- ➤ **Must** include chord progressions, substitutions and/or alterations.
- Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music.
- > The work **must** be given a title.
- > The final work **must** be either computer written or hand written **by the candidate**.
- A copy of the melody outline must be sent to the Area Manager 21 days prior to the commencement date of the examinations, as specified on the NZMSM calendar.

#### Part One:

- > Bars 1 to 8 a melody line must be added.
- Bars 9 to 16 a melody line and chords must be added.

#### Part Two: Bars 17 to 36

- Must modulate into a different key.
- > A melody line and chords **must** be added.

# PIECES: 60 marks

Choose pieces from each of sections I, II and III.

All pieces must have an introduction and ending where none is given.

Themes **may** be interwoven and the whole arrangement **must** stand as a musically cohesive entity.

Any alterations, substitutions and additions **must** be marked on the music.

A variety of modern basses from any source is expected.

Expression and dynamics must be included and marked on the music.

An advanced level of improvisation, musicality and creativity is expected.

The maximum duration for each section is five minutes.

A copy of all the arrangements must be sent to the Area Manager 21 days prior to the commencement date of the examinations, as specified on the NZMSM calendar.

# **Criteria for this section:**

- > The pieces **must** be in **two** different keys.
- Modulation **must** be used between the two keys.
- Harmony and syncopation are expected.
- A variety of bass styles **must** be used.
- The titles of the two pieces must be listed on the Checklist sheet.

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Section II: 20 marks Four Boogies Book, Alan Burch

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# **Criteria for this section:**

Improvisation must be added.

A variety of boogie bass styles **must** be used.

# Section III: 20 marks Beatles Medley

> Choose **three** pieces from any NZMSM publication.

## **Criteria for this section:**

- > The pieces **must** be played in **three** different keys.
- Modulating chords **must** be used between each key.
- Chord substitutions must be used.
- > A variety of bass styles **must** be used.

> Choose **one** piece from the publications listed above.

## **Criteria for this section:**

- > Must be of at least three pages duration.
- > The maximum time allowance is five minutes.
- > A copy of the piece must be sent to the Area Manager 21 days prior to the commencement date of the examinations, as specified on the NZMSM calendar.

All markings must be removed from pieces except tidy fingering, expression marks and notation of arrangement.
