TECHNICAL WORK: 20 marks

Comprehensive Book of Scales and Arpeggios Magic for Modern Book

To be played from memory.

Scales: mm 132

Major, Harmonic and Melodic Minor Scales of B, F# and Eb

Four octaves, **similar motion**, ascending and descending, hands together. Legato and staccato.

Pentatonic Major and Minor scales of F

Two octaves, **similar motion**, ascending and descending, hands together.

Chromatic scale of A, a major sixth apart

Two octaves, ascending and descending, hands together. Left hand commences on C, right hand on A.

Arpeggios: mm 120

Tonic major seventh in the keys of B and Eb Diminished seventh in the keys of B and Eb

e.g: Key of B = B maj.7 and A# dim.7

Four octaves, ascending and descending, hands together.

Studies: (No pedal)

Magic for Modern, Exercise No.60

The Seventh Chord Whole Tone Scales.

Both examples **must** be played.

Cycle of Fifths - see below



AURAL: 15 marks

- To recognize whether a chord played in root position is augmented or diminished. The candidate will then identify the degrees by letter name.
- To recognize whether a phrase is in a major or minor key.

 The candidate will then identify whether the ending cadence is perfect (V-1) or Interrupted (V-VI).
- To observe a four bar melody and then play it from memory. In 6/8 time.

VIVA VOCE: 10 marks

- General questions will be asked on all pieces performed and the technical work for this grade. This will include styles such as: Ballad, Boogie Woogie.
- To explain the construction of all chords up to and including thirteenth chords.
- To explain the construction of the pentatonic major and minor scales.

MELODY OUTLINE: 20 marks

Criteria for this section:

- Both parts should be developed within the criteria given to make a complete piece.
- > Freedom of harmonization for parts one and two.
- > Two contrasting bass styles must be added to the work.
- Expression and dynamics must be included and marked on the music.
- The work must be given a title.
- The final work must be either computer written or hand written by the candidate.
- A copy of the melody outline must be sent to the Area Manager 21 days prior to the commencement date of the examinations, as specified on the NZMSM calendar.
- The four bar introduction must include chords and a melody line using the pentatonic scale, whole tone scale or chromatic run down or part thereof.

Part One:

- > Bars 1 to 8 the melody **must** include passing, auxiliary and chromatic notes.
- > Bars 9 to 16 the melody and chords must be continued.
- May have a maximum of two chords per bar.
- ➤ The bass progression: **Ilm V7 I must** be included at least once.

Part Two: Bars 17 to 32

- The time signature may be changed.
- A more comprehensive melody **must** be added.
- Modern signs and embellishments **must** be included.
- Some chord substitutions and/or chord alterations must be included.
- A maximum of **four** chords per bar **may** be added.
- An appropriate ending for the style of the piece **must** be added.

PIECES: 85 marks Graded Tunes, Book 5 and 7

Supplementary Tunes, Book 2 Popular Standards Book

The Four Boogies Book, Alan Burch Alfred's Greatest Hits Book, Level 3

Four pieces must be performed, one from each section.

All pieces must have an introduction and ending where none is given.

Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music.

Style, improvisational skill and creative ability are expected for this grade.

A copy of the arrangements for sections I, IIIA or IIIB and section IV must be sent to the Area Manager 21 days prior to the commencement date of the examinations, as specified on the NZMSM calendar.

Section I: ARRANGEMENT OF SET PIECE 20 marks

Criteria for this section:

- Freedom of arrangement.
- > **Must** include chord substitutions, alterations and additions.
- Must use a suitable rhythm or rhythms.
- Any alterations must be marked on the music by the candidate.

No repeats except D.C. or D. S. or as indicated for a specific piece.

Section II: 20 marks

Section IIIA: NOTATED PIECE 20 marks

Alfred's Greatest Hits, Level 3

Choose one piece from the publication listed.
 Exclude the following two pieces:
 Getting to Know You.
 I Love Lucy.

Repeats are optional.

OR

Section IIIB: COMPOSITION 20 marks

Criteria for this section:

- > Must consist of thirty two bars, excluding the introduction.
- > Chord symbols **must** be included.
- > Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music.
- > The work **must** be given a title.
- > The piece may be either computer written or hand written by the candidate.

Section IV: MEDLEY 25 marks

Supplementary Tunes, Book 2

> Choose **three** pieces from the publication listed above.

Criteria for this section:

- The three pieces **must** be arranged as a medley.
- The medley **must** be in **three** different keys, using a four chord modulation between each key.
- The maximum duration for the medley is **five** minutes.
- ➤ The titles of the three pieces **must** be listed on the Checklist sheet.

All markings must be removed from pieces except tidy fingering, expression marks and notation of arrangement.
