- What type of rhythm or style is this piece played?
- What does D.C. or D.S al Fine mean?
- What does Fine mean?
- What does Cantabile and poco a poco rit e diminuendo mean in the House of the Rising Sun?
- What is the key signature. Explain how to identify a minor key.
- Types of notes e.g. how many counts is a dotted quaver
- Name the chords and the notes being played
- What count do you start on? Is there an upbeat anacrusis
- What is a waltz?
- Explain tempo markings for e.g Allegro vivace
- Point out any 1st and 2nd endings explain
- Identify anacrusis or up-beat e.g why has the last bar only have 2 beats?
- Types of rests values and names
- Identify a pause sign

- Rhythmic bass patterns based on a chord student may be asked to explain this for e.g Moody Blues bars 1 -4 notes based on what chord?
- Knowledge of double bar lines, brace, parts of the staff
- Knowledge of accidentals e.g. what is this sign # mean? What sharp do you have to play in this piece?
- Explain the time signature e.g compound timing
- What does loco mean? Just a Beat piece
- Explain bass rhythm pattern e.g. Western Ballad, boogie walking bass
- Why are notes written smaller in piece Bright Eyes? This is a fill improvisation
- Explain ties and slurs
- Explain harmony, staccato, pedal signs.
- Point out the composer's name on the music information about composer
- Explain dynamic signs and rit
- Identify ledger notes
- Explain Repeat signs
- Explain what accents do
- Explain 8va if in the piece to play the piece 8 notes higher
- What does moderate swing mean?
- What is the song about?
- What country does the song come from?
- Good understanding of chords, arpeggios and key signatures.

Some Quick Facts

The Flying Trapeze – A movie, theme song from Those magnificent men and their flying machines.

Danube Waves – This is a waltz by Ivanovici. The Danube is the second longest river in Europe.

When Johnny comes Marching Home – a popular song of the American Civil War – expressing a longing for friends and family fighting in the war.

On Yonder Rock – From the opera Fra Diavolo by French composer Daniel Auber. First performed 1830 in Paris

House of the Rising Sun – a folk song from America. It tells of a life gone wrong in New Orleans. Best known rendition by the Animals in 1964

Dublin Town – This is an Irish jig. Dublin is the capital of Southern Ireland. First part of the song is Key G and after bar 9 becomes key of Em.

Green Door – a popular song in 1956 in America music by Bob Davie and Lyrics by Marvin Moore

Polish Dance – is a traditional folk dance in the Mazuraka style, charactereised by the accent on the second beat. A lively round dance and one of the national dances of Poland.

Bright Eyes – Song written for the sound track of Watership Down by Mike Batt and performed by Art Garfunkel.

Remember to word questions differently each lesson. Often the student know will know the answer, but they need to get accustomed to being asked the question in different ways.

Number the bars – so you can ask questions in this manner, for example in bar 13 name the treble note on the second beat.
