TECHNICAL WORK: 20 marks

Comprehensive Book of Scales and Arpeggios

To be played from memory.

Scales: mm] 96

Major Scales of A and Eb

Harmonic Minor Scales of F# and C

Two octaves, **similar motion**, ascending and descending, hands together.

Major Scale of Eb

Two octaves, contrary motion, hands together.

Chromatic Scale commencing on F#

Two octaves, ascending and descending, hands together.

Triad: mm 384

Primary Triad Scale of Bb

Right hand, 8va higher. One octave, ascending only.

Chords in bass position, one octave higher than in the scale book.

Arpeggios: mm , 84

A and Eb Major

C Minor

Two octaves, ascending and descending, hands together.

G7

Two octaves, ascending and descending, separate hands.

Memory Piece: Desert Road Blues

Must be played as written.

AURAL: 15 marks (Examiner to play twice)

- To clap or tap a four bar melody. In either 3/4 or 4/4 time. Time values include semiquaver and those of longer duration.
- To recognize whether a chord played in root position is major, minor or dominant seventh. In the keys of C, G, D, F and Bb.
- To identify a note being one of the degrees of the major scale.

 The tonic will be played and the tonic note given before each degree.

 Identify by Tonic Sol-fa, letter name or interval number.

 In the keys of C, G and F.

VIVA VOCE: 10 marks

> General questions will be asked about **all** pieces performed and the technical work for this grade.

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To identify the tonic and dominant chords of all pieces performed.

SIGHT READING: 15 marks

- > To play a twelve bar passage. In either 3/4 or 4/4 time.
- Bass style standard waltz No.3 OR stride OR arpeggio.
- In any key up to two sharps or two flats.

PIECES: 30 marks for each piece.

Popular Songs Book 2, Graded Tunes Book 3

Three pieces **must** be performed, **one** piece from each section.

Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music.

Bass pattern(s) and arrangement must be marked on the music by the candidate.

Chords for this grade may be simplified.

Right hand must be played using single notes OR octaves OR harmony OR a combination of these.

Counter bass and addition of slash chords is optional.

Annie's Song (repeat on page 4 must be played)

Choose one piece from the publication listed above.

Criteria for this section:

- May use full chords in the right hand.
- Must include: Harmony AA X.H. 8va higher a sixth ending run
- > Octaves or tenth rolls **may** be used on the first beat of the bar.
- > Bass style standard waltz bass No. 3 OR arpeggio bass OR a combination of both.
- > Annie's Song bass progressions **must** be used.

No repeats except D.C. or D.S. or as indicated for a specific piece.

Section II:

Graded Tunes Book 3

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Beautiful Sunday Don't Be Cruel See You Later Alligator

- > Choose **one** piece from the publication listed above.
- > May change cut time to common time.

Criteria for this section:

- Must include criteria from the previous grades.
- Must add an introduction and ending.
- ➤ **Must** include 8va higher.
- > Must include harmony.
- > May include syncopation.
- > Bass style either a walking bass or Boogie Woogie.

No repeats except D.C. or D.S. or as indicated for a specific piece.

Section III:

Here Comes the Sun Popular Songs Book 2
Clocks Popular Songs Book 2
Summer of 69 Popular Songs Book 2
Any piece Graded Tunes Book 3

> Choose **one** piece not previously performed from the publications listed.

Criteria for this section:

- Bass style(s) to be chosen by the candidate.
- Chords may be altered.
- > May add a bar to facilitate any modern fill.
- Some degree of arrangement **must** be included.
- A copy of the arrangement **must** be given to the examiner on examination day

No repeats except D.C. or D.S. or as indicated for a specific piece.

All markings must be removed from pieces except tidy fingering, expression marks and notation of arrangement. **STRICTLY NO PHOTOCOPYING**

Desert Road Blues

The blues scale is made up of degrees 1, 3b, 4, 4#, 5, 7b, 8 of the major scale. The blues scale can be used to create intros, endings, melody lines and is great to improvise on.
