- AURAL: 15 marks (Examiner to play twice on the piano)
- To clap a four bar melody. In either 3/4 or 4/4 time. Time values include semiquaver and those of longer duration.
- > To recognize whether a chord played in root position is major or minor or dominant seventh.

- To pick an eight bar melody on strings 1-4. . In 4/4 time.
- Either rest stroke or free stroke or a combination of both.
- ➢ In the key of G.

## PIECES: 30 marks for each piece

Three pieces **must** be performed, **one** piece from each section. Expression and dynamics **must** be included and marked on the music. Barre chords are optional. No repeats except D.C. or D.S. or as indicated for a specific piece.

- > Choose **one** piece from the publication listed.
- > A capo **may** be used for singing only.

#### Criteria for this section:

- Must add a four bar introduction using the melody in a different position. May be 8va or 8vb.
- > Must add a four bar ending using the melody and/or part of any tonic scale. eg major/pentatonic
- > Must use a minimum of 2 strum patterns.
- > May add fills.
- Must be either sung by the candidate or accompanied by another instrumentalist. The candidate must count in for the accompanist unless the candidate sings.

### Section III: Arrangement

- > Choose **one** piece not previously performed from Section I or Supplementary Tunes Book 2.
- > An introduction and ending **must** be added where none is given.

#### Criteria for this section:

- > Must include a minimum of eight bars lead.
- Must include at least two of the following: dual play ha
  - harmony




- > May use slides, pull off, hammer on or any other technique.

- > Any alterations **must** be marked on the music **by the candidate**.




